ITEM 1: Approve Action Notes From January 19, 2009 AFAC Teleconference.

ITEM 2: Protocol Manager/Library

Sean Quigley, USGS PNAMP Data Steward, will provide a presentation on the Protocol Manager/Library, a resource designed to help project implementers choose protocols for field sampling.

ITEM 3: Coordinated Regional Aquatic Monitoring

Ken MacDonald will brief the AFAC on discussions/progress to date. The MAG has recommended official formation of an M&E Advisory Committee.

ITEM 4: Assignment from Members regarding analysis of relationships between subbasin objectives and basin-wide goals.

At their January 21-22, 2009 meeting in Boise, the Members assigned the AFAC to work with the MAG to develop strategies to (1) identify how the 5 million fish goal was established by the Northwest Power Planning Council (Council) for the 1987 Fish and Wildlife Program, (2) summarize how current objectives have been established, and (3) develop criteria for establishing population goals (including broad sense recovery). A draft memo has been prepared that (1) summarizes how the 5 million fish goal was developed, and (2) compares estimates of fish runs from the original

analysis by Council Staff to recent analysis by the AFAC.

The AFAC should review and discuss the assignment and the draft memo to MAG. The AFAC should discuss a plan for working on parts (2) and (3) of the assignment from the Members.

ITEM 5: Status of the Resource Report

Dave Ward will provide an update on the display of limiting factors in the SOTR. AFAC members should be prepared to review specific and appropriate sections of the SOTR by early April to ensure accuracy and completeness.
