On August 28, 2009 the subgroup discussed the first draft of the passage standards document. The draft is considered the initial step in the first of three “tiers,” which are: (1) Identification and definition of potential lamprey passage metrics, (2) determination of which metrics are most relevant and measurable, and (3) application of standards to chosen metrics.

Based upon the discussion of August 28, the next draft of Tier 1 has been completed by Chris Caudill and Josh Murauskas

The subgroup will discuss the draft and determine the next steps forward, including preliminary discussions of Tier 2.
