ITEM 1: Final Comments on Paper

Discussion: The subgroup discussed the current draft of the lamprey translocation paper. The draft incorporates revisions resulting from recent comments provided primarily by the Nez Perce, Umatilla, and Warm Springs Tribes. The subgroup was generally satisfied with the revisions.

As decided by the subgroup, final revisions to be incorporated include (1) replacing the translocation guidelines with those recently adopted by the four CRITFC Tribes, (2) deleting the placeholder for Figure 2 (map of harvest areas) and revising text accordingly, (3) clarifying text in the Uncertainties section, and (4) referencing the Critical Uncertainties document and lamprey monitoring strategy in the Uncertainties Section.

Dave Ward will make these changes and distribute the document to the subgroup for final review. Comments will be due back to Dave by September 10. Dave will then forward the document to Christina for distribution to the LTWG. The LTWG will discuss the document during the October meeting.
