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Discussion:

Joe Mentor provided the background for the CBFWA in lieu response, which is a response to BPA during an informal comment period. A document distributed at the April NPCC Meeting comments on the 2007-2009 funding decision. He explained the research of in lieu letter giving history to the Act.

Joe focused on the expenditures not the activity, translating the memo into the letter, interpretation of the Act. Review the BPA and NPCC questions and the F&W managers' answers. This is a response to protect project FY09 funding.

Joe raised concerns regarding, a blanket appropriation, gray areas overlapping the expenditures for cost sharing, and no funding until Congress appropriates funding.

The F&W Managers have the best position because they are mentioned in the Act. Should the response be built on BPA questions, contain a statement of intent to clarify the interpretation of the Act using language straight from the Act, and provide the interpretation of the Act for FY09 funding decisions to set projects.

Action:

The MAG agreed to five specific points for the draft letter.

- The MAG agreed to provide a CBFWA response to BPA's informal draft
- Translate In lieu memo into the in lieu letter for Members review
- State FY08-09 funding needs
- Provide interpretation of In lieu referencing the Act
- MAG requested review of revised draft response before distributed

Brian asked the MAG to approve the coordination and framework proposal to participate with other coordination groups and apply the definitions to the FY08-09 CBFWA projects.

The MAG reviewed the "Regional Coordination for the Fish and Wildlife Program Today and Tomorrow: Current Status and proposed future definitions" draft and requested that the context of the draft be associated with Joe Mentor's products too. Truth this document with the Authorities White Paper. Layout the context to support coordination through the Program. Add more description to the deliverables. They requested changes on page 2a under Coordination in sentence one and page 3b under Consultation: revise sentence two, <u>Coordination in not consultation</u>. Delete page 9, Proposed funding levels for regional coordination (FY08 and beyond). Improve the document and anticipate criticism from leadership.

Staff requested direction and that the CBFWA work plan to be reviewed at the October Members meeting. Tom Iverson presented for discussion a draft conceptual timeline and table to coordinate the CBFWA, NPCC, and local planning groups for the Amendment Process, 2010 Project Selection Process for 2007-2009, and the BPA rate case informal discussions. This is a concept on how these processes interact. He stated that this is an opportunity for the F&W managers to respond to the process, assist in developing decision criteria, work with other groups, and promote CBFWA products. Tom Iverson contacted the NPCC staff to collect information and provided them with the idea for discussion at their retreat.

The MAG had a long discussion and could not agree on the details in the timeline. Brian Lipscomb suggested that MAG work out the details later. Brief the Members on the concept tomorrow and get their approval or final endorsement at the November 7 Members teleconference.

Tom Iverson and Brian Lipscomb presented the data management project funding recommendation strategy, proposed actions and drafts. Tom requested feedback for the MAG on the data management work plan. The data management issues will be harder to deal with later.

The MAG asked for costs, timeframe, and which, specific contracts would be addressed. The MAG assumes zero fund allocation. They are not comfortable with new positions or prepared to make funding decisions until they have more information

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> and time to review. The MAG supports the strategy to define outstanding data management needs.

Tom Iverson gave an overview the data management SOW's. He stated that NED is presenting a list of pilot projects at the October NPCC meeting agenda.

The MAG does not support moving the funding recommendation forward today. The MAG agreed that data management needs should be restructured in the region, but do not agree on the cost. The MAG agreed that these needs should be assessed to other outstanding needs. The MAG is not ready to make funding recommendations.

The MAG developed a recommendation for the Members to endorse and continue involvement with DMFS to refine and finalize the data management strategy. The MAG continued discussing priorities for implementation of strategies and funding recommendations.

The MAG revised the data management strategy working draft through section 5 and deleted all references to costs for FY08-09 funding but included parts of section 6. They will continue discussions on defining the gaps.

Joe Mentor presented the final draft Authorities White Paper as it relates to the Power Act and the amendment checklist and organization outline for the CBFWA Program recommendations. Joe included more updated information, a section on selected issues, referenced cases that reaffirm, strengthen, and identify that deference principals are owed to fish and wildlife managers through the Program recommendations, referenced rate setting process, interpretation of the Power Act, TANG decision, and added website links to support references. Under Selected Issues III, Joe identified a) Projects vs. Program Measures b) Reconciling the NW Power Act with ESA c) In Lieu Funding Prohibition d) Wildlife Crediting e) Fish Passage Center f) Relationship of the F&W Program and BPA Rate Case. Joe suggested that Members read the Golden Northwest Aluminum, Inc., v. BPA case referenced on page 27 of the white paper. On May 3, 2007, the Ninth Circuit issued its ruling in Golden Northwest Aluminum, Inc. v. Bonneville Power Administration

Joe requested that the MAG review the draft amendment checklist and white paper, specifically the selected issues section, and provide comments. The white paper will move forward as an appendix with the CBFWA recommendations. Joe plans to have Authorities White Paper published.

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Joe stated that if NPCC had a choice they would not change the 2000 Program. He recommended that the Members use the existing the 2000 Program and offer specifics to the recommendations.

Discussion:

The MAG stated the first six questions of the amendment checklist are a good and statutory, but numbers seven and eight are already in the Program and suggested guidance from the NPCC. Confirm that the checklist is consistent with the proposed recommendations.

Update:

Jim Uehara presented the update on the Resident Fish Committee progress. RFAC is working on three assignments from MAG to develop strategy for resident fish losses, develop formula to convert resident fish for losses of anadromous fish, develop measures and strategies for focal species and populations. The RFAC cannot develop a conversion formula and is requesting MAG's direction on restoring anadromous fish opportunities and restoring anadromous fish to the block areas. Ron Peters, CdAT stated, they cannot be fully mitigated for the loss species but will use other species for fishing opportunities. The RFAC will continue working on populating the templates and developing a loss assessment procedure but need due dates established by the MAG.

Mark Bagdovitz suggested that the RFAC propose due dates for MAG's review.
