On September 3rd, the Members directed CBFWA staff to develop a comment letter for review by the MAG and to ask the MAG to recommend if the letter would be best sent by the Agencies and Tribes collectively or individually. The MAG members responded with the majority of comments directed at a collective letter

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from CBFWA Members. On September 9th, the Members received the edited letter and notice that the teleconference to approve the letter was arranged. In the interim, CBFWA staff received additional edits to the letter and the revised draft version 3 was emailed for Members review the morning of the teleconference.

Action:

The Members approved the draft, version 3, ESA comment letter as presented (http://www.cbfwa.org/Committees/Members/meetings/2008-0911/ESAProposedChangesCommentLtrrFinalDraft.pdf). No objections.

Abstentions:

Mark Bagdovitz, USFWS, stated that USFWS abstains. Mark also communicated that in his conversation with NOAA/NMFS, they expressed that they also abstain. Brian Lipscomb, CBFWA, advised that Paul Kline advised that IDFW abstains.

Brian Lipscomb will contact the Members not on the phone to review the action to approve the letter and obtain their agreement. Once all Members have been contacted, the letter will be sent reflecting Members' consent.
