ITEM 2:	Review and Approve June 4, 2009 Draft Action Notes	
	The draft action notes for the June 4, 2009 RFAC meeting were approved as final.	
ITEM 3:	Resident Fish Loss Assessment and Resident Fish Substitution Template Presentations to the CBFWA MAG and Members: Update	
	Sheri Sears and Neil Ward led participants in a review of the RFAC's draft letters pertaining to habitat loss assessment methodology and recommended edits to the Independent Scientific Advisory Board's draft risk assessment template that project sponsors will have to complete, per the Northwest Power and Conservation Council' (NPCC) Amended Fish and Wildlife Program (Program), prior to implementing existing and new resident fish substitution projects for which non-native fish are to b released in the Columbia River Basin.	
ACTION:	The RFAC advised Neil to revise the draft letter and to make it available for RFAC review prior to the August Members' Meeting. In addition, the RFAC directed Neil contact the Kalispel and Spokane tribes seeking their endorsement of the RFAC's proposed habitat loss assessment methodology. The RFAC suggested that Neil draft letter that the Kalispel and Spokane tribes could consider using as a template for the development of their own letters.	
ITEM 4:	Resident Fish Losses: Development of Methodology to Assess Operational Loss	es
	The NPCC's Program contains the following objective to address resident fish losses "Complete the assessments of resident fish losses resulting from the development and operation of the hydrosystem, when and where there is agreement on the appropriate methodology and prioritization of an assessment. As these are available, the Council will consider adopting the loss assessments into the Program." Sheri Sears led the RFAC in an initial discussion regarding the development of an appropriate method to assess resident fish losses that are associated with the operation of the Federal	d e l

Columbia River Power System. The RFAC began to review the procedures that Montana used to develop their loss assessment as well as considering the "ecosystem" approach that the Kootenai Tribe of Idaho is currently developing.
