What is the Registry?

- Online, centralized database
- Records, tracks and maps conservation actions across the landscape
- User-friendly format for data entry and retrieval

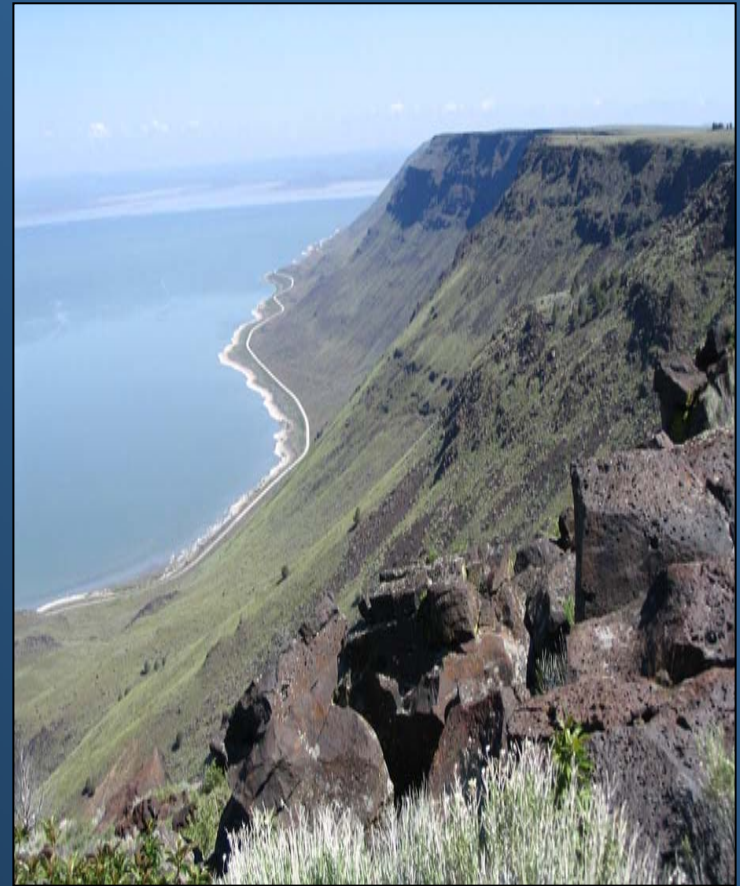

Why is it necessary?

- State Wildlife Action Plans
 - Need for a tool to track and monitor conservation actions
 - Stakeholder group working with Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife



Why is it necessary? (cont.)

- Lack of centralized location for tracking conservation actions
- Impossible to determine
 - Where actions are taking place
 - If actions match priorities
- Missed opportunities for collaboration among actions, landowners and partners



How will it work?

- Manual data entry, batch uploads, data sharing
- State and organization-specific portals
- Linkage/integration with other databases and information

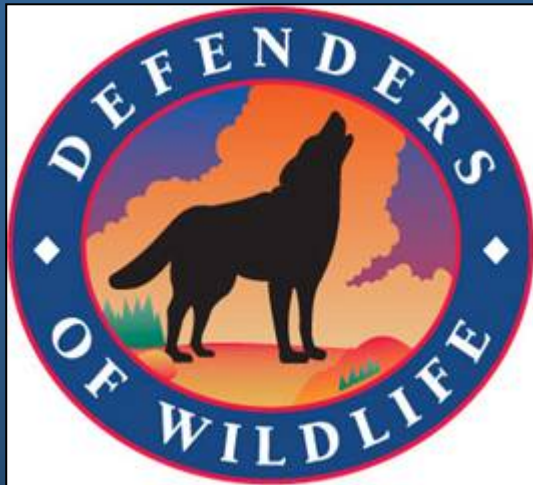
