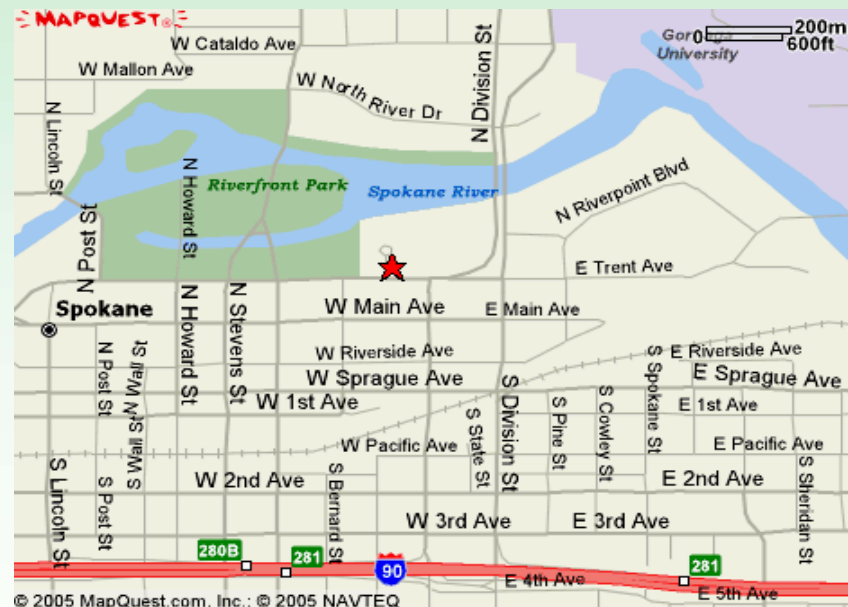

An informative abstract contains a statement of the problem and its significance, stated objectives, principle findings, and application, and it conforms to the requested format.
